

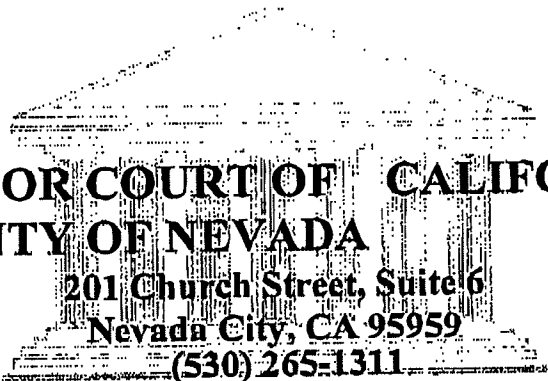

**BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR – PUBLIC COMMENT (Per Government Code Section 54954.3)**

**David Wellner**, 212 Cottage St – Stated that one year ago he came to the Council with his concern about ringing the Fire House Bell at 5:30 a.m. for the 9-11 ceremony; it's very early and he believes the noise ordinance prohibits that sound at that hour; suggests ringing the bell at 8:30 a.m. West Coast Time, when the event happened; feels it would be more appropriate at that time.

**Direction:** Staff to agendize for next Council meeting.

**Gregg Schiffner**, Heilman Ct – Stated he wanted to comment on Item 5A under Old Business but it is agendized as Public Hearing Closed.

- City Attorney DeGraw stated that Item 5A is a continuation of Council discussion and all the time for public comment and discussion was at the last meeting, so it's not appropriate to do it now or later in the meeting. It's indicated on the agenda as 'Public Hearing Closed' and someone that doesn't come tonight because of the agenda, but you allow others to speak, would create an unfair playing field. ## PUBLIC HEARINGS

**A. Subject:** Review Draft Proposed Ordinance No. 2011-XX Adding Chapter 9.14 to the Nevada City Municipal Code Regulating Conduct on Public Property – First Reading

City Attorney DeGraw stated he was instructed by Council to make the suggested changes and look into the infraction fine; he gave background information referring to his staff report included in the packet; he talked to Chief Trovato; ordinance is brought back for first reading.

- Councilmember Harris stated she would like to hear from Lou.
- Chief Trovato stated that he believes this is a reasonable approach versus using Penal Codes 370 and 647; it allows the police to identify behavior that is unacceptable and provide warning, then cite when necessary; this is a good ordinance for our tool box.
- Vice Mayor Strawser asked Lou if he liked it the way it is written or if there were any language changes he would make.
- Chief Trovato stated he was fine with it; excellent to have this; something has to be done and this is a reasonable way to go.

Public Comment

**Stephen Greenberg**, Turpentine Dr. – Stated the following points about this proposed ordinance: 1) Political - in 1998 it was rejected; 2) Historical - referred to the 1999 Chamber Committee Report; 3) Legal - there are already California penal codes in place; 4) Economics - probably were much worse back in 1999; 5) Reality – perception is the merchants want this new law; he added that he conducted a survey and interviewed 8 business owners and 6 employees which asked for more police presence only; 6) Enforcement Scenarios - don't have enough staffing to enforce; 7) Conclusion - to have more police presence.

**Jennifer Smith** – Stated she's seen use of drugs and intoxication on lower Commercial St; don't want to see someone having a cup of coffee getting in trouble; the real laws that are being broken are not being enforced.

**Jusiah**, Douglas Rd – Stated concern that the law won't be enforced equally; asked if the law was being drafted to targeted individuals; need more police presence; this law is not created to help us; do not take away the rights of people to control population.

**Bob Buhlis** – Stated the following points: 1) Sees a lot of negative things in the Alpha parking lot; has seen more police presence; it's a handful of people, not currently in town, usually in the winter, that have caused the problem; 2) as Chamber of Commerce representative he read a letter by the Chamber (also included in the packet under Correspondence).

**Mia Nash**, Nevada City – Agreed with Greenberg's conclusions and shares many concerns of Jusiah; there are enough laws on the books to enforce and people have to get involved so police can do their job.

**Thomas Thornhill** – Asked if there is such a thing as a standardized width of a sidewalk; 'willful' is a rubber band word; the CSO's are not sworn officers by the struggle of hand; try again.

**Charles Durrett**, Redbud Way & Commercial St – Provided a power point presentation that suggested making a walking street out of Commercial Street; let's give a major amenity to the town; I'm arguing to try something different and not pass the law tonight.

**Jerry Bloom**, 302 Park Ave – Stated he has loitered in Nevada City for 32 years; we're a tourist town; should be allowed to loiter in the streets; this is the wrong ordinance; laws already exist; this doesn't have anything about bus stops; a law like this enhances selected enforcement.

**Kirk Valentine**, 140 Boulder St & Classic Café – Stated he liked Chuck's idea; he circulated a survey for a pedestrian only street and the response was 90% of people said great idea; this situation was prompted by the homeless; ask Lou to comment on police discretion and how has he set policy within the Police Department?

**Marianna Greenberg** – Stated she is now a business owner in town; why can't police just warn with a misdemeanor?

**Zowie Tofaletti**, 160 Redbud Way – Don't like this law; never have felt unsafe in town; avoid passing laws that I might do innocently.

**Bob Lobell**, Eden Ranch Rd – Stated he made a case last meeting with 370; still thinks that 370 is still better than this ordinance proposed; don't have a common presence of foot patrol; love to see community approve a sales tax increase if that promotes community policing; the 1999 report language of aggressive recruitment of volunteers; asked why don't we have volunteer CSO's to help make community policing?

**Roger Savage**, Nevada St – Supports this ordinance; might be a good idea to run it by criminal attorney; Council needs to take steps now to help and keep downtown safe; heard these complaints, including Councilmember's complaints, for years; City has dedicated honest police officers that would treat this ordinance fairly; this gives police department more tools to use in a fair way; please pass the ordinance.

**Greg Cook**, Friartuck's owner of 38 years – Stated these are quality of life issues and we need to take a bite out of this and take charge with a simple ordinance such as this; Police Blotter is mostly Commercial Street.

**Gail Fox**, 115 Cottage St – Supports the ordinance; it addresses behaviors, especially on Commercial Street; would appreciate not having to walk in the street; should not be an inconvenience to me.

**Jillian Brooks** – Stated that she feels inconvenienced but not unsafe; need bigger sidewalk; supports what Chuck presented.

**George Foster**, 405 N Pine St – Merchants and business people have been asking for something for a long time; this issue has been before the Council; Council should act on this.

**Michael Anderson (email)**, Stated that the ordinance is a big waste of time; enforce the law that's in place.

**Ben Emery (email)**, Stated customers first, employees second, and people third.

**Doug Lang**, Redbud Way – Stated his respect for police; will encourage someone sitting on sidewalk to bring in their legs.

Public Comment – Closed

- Mayor McKay reiterated that this is not an anti-loitering law; stated that Grass Valley has issued 3 tickets in 3 years with their law; in 1994 Santa Cruz passed their ordinance with no adverse behavior and has issued 23 citations for a population of 60 thousand; this ordinance is very specific; do not use state penal code because it requires a victim; this is a very fair town.

Questions of Chief Trovato:

1) What is the policy set for police discretion?

- Chief Trovato answered that he meets with the police department and sets procedures to provide warning with explanation of behavior.

2) Does the Police Department recruitment volunteers?

- Chief Trovato answered that the department had one and he quit because of the nasty behavior on the streets he encountered; others in the past have also been very uncomfortable.

- Councilmember Harris asked City Attorney DeGraw if we should have a criminal attorney look at it.
- City Manager Brennan stated that this ordinance is crafted to where he didn't feel it necessary.
- Vice Mayor Strawser stated to Lou, that we are not manufacturing writing tickets to generate revenue.
- Councilmember Harris stated that it's not all about writing tickets; it's about working officer's presence that is important to the merchants; this gives a tool for the police department which is less heavy handed to avoid court time and witnesses; this ordinance is useful and less onerous but we need to go beyond this as well.
- Councilmember Bergman stated he walks on Commercial Street a lot; experienced to having to divert and have observed others having to divert as well; the people speaking in opposition should help talk to others in solving this issue.
- Vice Mayor Strawser stated he's tired of talking about this with 13 years on the Chamber Board, merchants and citizens; don't want to step on human rights; asked why we are so worked up about a few; don't think a walking street on Commercial Street is a solution; ordinance won't be used to target specific people just those making it uncomfortable and unsafe; wants to give the police what they need to enforce safety; this is an issue and problem with a small group that need to be dealt with.
- Councilmember Senum stated this is about a few bad apples; wished we had the boardwalk in place now; time to get this done.
- Councilmember Harris stated it's time that we did something; staff did a good job; if it's not fairly done then bring it to the Council or City Manager; agrees to move forward with this ordinance; this is not anti-loitering it's about blocking sidewalks.
- Mayor McKay stated he thought Chuck's idea is a great one but it will take time; this is a user friendly town; we'll make sure police is fair; this is not an anti-loitering law.

**Action:** Motion by Harris, seconded by Strawser to waive reading of the ordinance and read title only with changing Section 9.14.040A to remove the words 'Historical District'.

**Roger Savage**, 321 Nevada St – Agrees with Glenda; hope the end result is that Nevada City has control; Litchfield has a good reputation in town; what type of bonding will be required.
