UTILITY WORK ON COMMERCIAL STREET

The City has been working with a local contractor CME Services for much needed replacement of aging water, sewer and storm drain facilities on Commercial St. between Union & Pine Streets. The project began in mid-April, and we had some delays from weather and utility conflicts but were able to complete the installation of sewer. After the trenches were paved on June 10th, we stopped work for 10 days to lessen

the inconvenience caused to businesses that are reopening during this challenging time for our community. We are now mobilizing for the replacement of the water system which is expected to be completed by July 31st.

City staff understands and acknowledges that the work causes disruption to a vital part of our historic downtown. We will be working with the contractor

to lessen the amount of disruption with better communication and delineation of pedestrian access. We will also be attentive to any special needs or concerns. If you have questions, please call the front desk of City Hall: 530-265-2496 x100.

On June 1st the City Mgr. with support from the City Council passed a proclamation allowing restaurants and retail businesses to operate outside of normal operating City policies. Out-

door Dining is allowed with use of parking spaces, some fees have been waived, and signage restrictions have been relaxed. Businesses must present a plan of action before implementing

these allowable activities with time for the police, fire and planning departments to review.
