



Welcome to Play-Well TEKologies. We are excited to play, explore, create & build together! Below is all the information you need to be prepared for camp.

DATES: August 3-7

WHERE: Seaman's Lodge – Pioneer Park (427 Nimrod St.)

TIME: 9:00a – noon (5-7 year olds) or 1:00 – 4:00p (7-12 year olds)

Drop off begins 15 minutes prior to the program start time. All campers must be picked up at program end time.

WHAT TO BRING:

The following is a list of items that your camper should bring to camp EVERY day. If there are any additional items that they need to bring, camp staff will inform you when you pick up/drop off your child.

- ✓ Campers may not take Lego creations home, so we encourage bringing cameras to camp to take pictures of your creations.
- ✓ Campers should wear comfortable clothes & shoes that they can run, jump and play in.
- ✓ Snacks (tips & ideas are included below.)
- ✓ Water bottle
- ✓ Hand sanitizer (optional)

Mark your name on all items; put it all in a Backpack and you should be ready for a day of fun!

We request that you NOT allow your child to bring toys, electronics, cell phones, etc. to camp.

SNACK TIPS:

- ✓ Please bring peanut-free snacks.
- ✓ There will not be refrigerator space available for your child's snacks.
- ✓ Do not send foods that need to be microwaved.
- ✓ Semi-perishable or non-perishable foods are recommended.

MEDICATIONS:

Camp Staff cannot administer medications to participants without written consent from a parent. No medications can be provided by the Camp Employees or Nevada City Parks and Recreation. If your child needs to take medication while at camp, please notify the Camp Director.

COVID-19 INFORMATION:

COVID Guidelines for City and Camp staff is on page 2. Things your family can do to help stop the spread are:

- ✓ Remind your child to wash their hands frequently and to cough & sneeze into a tissue or elbow.
- ✓ Take steps to keep/boost a healthy immunity.
- ✓ Before taking your child to camp each day, check for fever, coughing or other signs of illness. If your child is sick, they may not attend camp.
- ✓ If your child uses a face covering, be sure that it is properly cleaned.
- ✓ If your child tests positive for COVID-19 or is in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, inform City and Camp Staff right away.
- ✓ Camps could be cancelled at any time due to COVID-19.

MISC:

The Camp Director will receive the contact and emergency contact information that you provide with registration. If you would like for the Camp Director to have additional information about your child (ie: allergies, persons who can pick up your child, etc) please provide that information to camp staff on the first day.

COVID-19 GUIDELINES 2020

DECIDING TO OPEN

State & Local Guidance

In accordance with local guidance related to COVID-19, the City and Camp Directors will be implementing the following practices into camp programs.

Protection of Higher Risk Participants and Employees

The City recommends that employees and campers who are higher risk for contracting COVID-19, wear a face covering, keep distance from others as able and wash hands or use hand sanitizer regularly. We trust each individual to protect themselves as they see fit and ask that parents provide any necessary information about their higher risk camper to the Camp Director.

Screening Participants and Employees

The City and Camp Directors will not do daily screenings of all campers and employees, but any camper or employee who complains of feeling ill will be isolated as best as possible, will have their temperature taken and will be sent home. Parents of all campers and the City will be notified if anyone associated with camp tests positive for COVID-19.

HEALTH & SAFETY ACTIONS

Healthy Hygiene Practices

- > Campers and employees will be required to wash hands after handling shared equipment, before eating and before leaving for the day.
- > Healthy hygiene practices, such as keeping hands away from your face, covering coughs and sneezes and hand washing will be encouraged.
- > Face coverings are optional for employees and campers.

Cleaning & Disinfecting of Camp Spaces

- > When applicable and able, supplies used at camp will be divided in advance, so that each camper is using their own materials and not sharing with other campers.
- > The air conditioning unit will be ran on a setting that brings in fresh air and any necessary maintenance will take place prior to the start of camps beginning. Camp Directors have the option to open all windows and doors to allow for fresh air flow.
- > The facility will be cleaned each week by the City and frequently touched surfaces will be cleaned daily. Additional cleaning will be done if there are other users at the facility during non-camp hours. Camp Directors will be provided with Clorox and other cleaning supplies so they can clean as necessary during the week of camp.

Social Distancing

- > Parents & participants will be distanced from each other during drop-off and pick-up times.
- > Our camp programs do not always allow for social distancing, but when able and without degrading the quality of the program, campers and employees will distance themselves from each other and will work in the same groups each day of camp.
- > Only camp employees, campers & parents will be allowed in the camp facility during camp hours. City staff will only enter the facility during camp hours if necessary for cleaning, maintenance or program needs.

Training of Employees

All Camp Directors and their employees will understand and adhere to these guidelines. They are also required to be familiar with the guidance materials provided by Nevada County.

ONGOING MONITORING

Signs & Symptoms

- > Camp Directors and their employees will be watchful and aware of any campers who do not feel well. Any camper or employee who complains of feeling ill will be isolated as best as possible, will have their temperature taken and will be sent home. Parents of all campers and the City will be notified if any camper tests positive for COVID-19.
- > Any camper or employee who feels ill will stay home.

Reports of Illness

During the week of camp, if a camper contracts COVID-19 or comes in contact with someone who has COVID-19, that week of camp may be cancelled and refunds will be made as described on Page 1.

If the City is notified after a week of camp is completed that a camper tested positive for COVID-19 or came in contact with someone who tested positive for COVID-19 during the week of camp, all campers & their parents will be notified.
